

Recruitment testing for 2017 has now been finalised. Testing was done to see if your child is suited to their preferred instrument and if they are physically able to blow it if necessary. Children were physically tested on every instrument. Unfortunately the preferred instrument is not always suited due to physical attributes, so the child is offered another choice when they see what is available to them. All children who applied received a note last Friday to inform you that they have been accepted, unaccepted or put on a waiting list. Acceptance is based on assessment covering pitch, rhythm, embouchure, musicality, behaviour, numeracy, literacy and reading level achievements by the instrumental instructor, classroom music teacher and classroom teacher. We also look at how many children are continuing in the program and how many minutes of instrumental instruction has been allocated to the school for 2017. Class sizes are based on an average of 6 children per class and distributing instruments to find a balance for ensembles. All children who were accepted should have attended our information evening on Wednesday, 16th November.

There are parents in the school who have instruments to sell for next year's recruits. Lots of students will be upgrading or not continuing around the Townsville area, so there is a good chance to pick up a quality secondhand instrument. Look in your local papers regularly – but please get any instrument checked thoroughly by someone to make sure any repairs will not outweigh the cost of the instrument. We strongly discourage buying from Ebay. If you have an instrument to sell – please email Fiona and I'll do my best to get it into the next newsletter before school finishes. You will need to supply the instrument, brand, cost, contact name and number.

This is our last newsletter from the music department for the year. A big thank you to all our choral and instrumental music members for 2016 and parents. We could not have had such a successful year with our Performance and Gala nights, Eisteddfod, Fanfare and school events without your help in getting your children to rehearsals and lessons. Organisation, persistence, confidence and resilience are all life-long learning skills that your child has accomplished well this year. We look forward to continuing our successful program with your help in 2017.

All the best to our graduating year 6 students. Thank you for your contribution to our music program, your dedication to our group is greatly appreciated.
