Being prepared from week to week As we are coming to the hallway point in the term it is important for students to maintain their practice routine and continue to work on their lesson and concert band pieces. Weekly practise helps with 'cementing' new concepts taught in lessons from short term into long term memories. It is only then that students feel prepared and confident to try more advanced musical techniques as well as being able to understand harder music theory concepts. It is this continuous cycle of weekly lesson attendance à practising those specific pieces à lesson attendance à personal practise on specific pieces etc that ensures the best chance of success and progression on their instrument.

Brass Students: ~ Townsville Eisteddfod Please ensure that you are attending your weekly rehearsal for your specific ensemble. Attendance at these rehearsals ARE NOT optional but rather a requirement from Education Queensland if you studying an instrument at The Willows SS. If you are unable to attend a lesson or rehearsal it is expected that a student either comes and explains their absence to a relevant staff member or write a letter or email to their instrument or concert band teacher.

- individually practising your skills at home in between training sessions? (Regularly practising your music & playing techniques at home i.e. tonguing, pitching the correct notes?)

If the answer is no, then you may need to rethink about how much effort you are putting in...... because if you were playing a sport without attending the training sessions and personally practising your skills you mostly likely would be sitting on the sidelines during the grand final rather than getting in on the action......

Rehearsals last week were exceptional with everyone and Heft the school Friday afternoon feeling very content in their abilities thus far. We will be having a run through with our visiting accompanist soon and they will sound even more amazing!!! I think they are excited and ready to perform at the Eisteddfod also. We still have some tidying up on all the pieces and synchronising actions for our novelty piece – but we are well on our way!! There are still a few junior who are unsure of the words – please keep learning them. They also have some actions to learn!!

We have extended rehearsal practise for seniors in the lead up to Eisteddfod. Children will rehearse during 2nd break on Friday's from 1.10pm ~ 1.40pm. They will return to class for eating time and to mark rolls, collect notes and bags etc and be expected back to the music room to rehearse from 1.55pm ~ 2.55pm.
