

Firstly, there are a number of students even at this stage of the year forgetting to bring their equipment or instruments to their lessons or leaving the instruments sitting in the classrooms week after week.

All students will be having their final assessment in week 5 so it is important that they practise and prepare for this task.

Instrumental music has a curriculum to follow just like any other subject and that is why students receive a grade and comments on their report cards. I would love to give your child the best possible mark but it is a team effort to make this happen!

The final assessment mark will reflect the student's preparation to lessons, practise at home and orchestra attendance.

All students are participating in the GALA CONCERT next Thursday.

It is very important I have FULL attendance of my groups in order to show case the wonderful skills and hard work that your child has been putting into their orchestras.

There will be AN EXTRA REHEARSAL for all my BEGINNER ORCHESTRA
STUDENTS THIS Wednesday 18th during the Celebration Strings Week. I will come from the workshops especially to take this rehearsal so please make sure your child brings their instrument to school on this day. This is so we can be ready for the school concert the following night. I have an expectation now for all students to be doing at least 1 hour of practise per

week at home. Most students are already doing this but if you think your child needs to put in greater effort please keep encouraging them, praising them and helping them to continue with their practise. I know myself being a musician that there are times when life gets busy and we don't always want to but the rewards are so much greater than the effort it takes in the end!

Continuation forms are now due back so please hand those in to Fiona Coleman so I can have an accurate assessment of numbers for recruiting the new students.

Finally, thank you for supporting your child this year in their music! They have certainly come a long way and I am sure they are looking forward to showing how far they have come at the GALA concert next Thursday!

TOWNSVILLE BRASS YOUTH BAND

Does your child play brass (trumpet, trombone, baritone or euphonium) or percussion, and want to take it further outside of school and beyond?

Townsville Brass Youth Band is one of three brass bands in the Townsville Brass organisation, and is a performing band in its own right! The band rehearses weekly with qualified instructors and regular visiting mentors from the rest of the organisation. Players can progress through the other bands, and it is a great way to develop brass banding through to adulthood.





Yearly membership is around \$40 per student, including loan of an instrument, uniform, music, music bag and tuition at rehearsals.

Rehearsals are Monday evenings 5:15pm to 6:30pm at the Cathedral School. All players with one year of experience in a school instrumental programme are welcome, and parents can sit in and listen at any time.
