Marine debris is a serious threat to oceans. Plastic is a particular issue because of its lightness and longevity. Over 8 million tonnes of 'stuff' from our daily lives enters the world's oceans each year. This debris endangers wildlife, destroys habitats, and enters our food chain.

The good news is that we can all make a difference by making small changes to our daily behaviours. Think about the items you use daily and aim to reduce your waste.

Volunteers collected and reported more than 67,000 litter items from around Townsville and Magnetic Island, from 2008 to 2017. The items here are regularly reported through the Tangaroa Blue Foundation's Australian Marine Debris Initiative database. You can help take action.
