Welcome to the first issue of 'The Pitch' for 2018. A newsletter designed especially for the music department at The Willows State School. The Pitch is generated to inform you of events coming up and news about what is happening with the children involved in the music program. We will endeavor to keep you informed as much as possible, but there may be an occasion where events just pop up with little notice. We would like to have more involvement between parents and teachers and feel that The Pitch will help create this communication. Emails are the most common form of communication. If you can let your child's teacher know of a current email address or make sure your details are updated on our system in case they need to contact you. Teacher's emails are listed below. We will be generating a distribution list, so please ensure we can contact you so you don't miss important information. We will also be using the Willows State School P&C Facebook page. Please like and keep informed for last minute changes.

Our Performing Arts Centre is centered right in the middle of the school. You can't miss us - or our big sign. All music lessons and rehearsals will be in this block. A reminder that more than 3 lessons missed may result in your child not continuing in the program. Please ensure you inform the school or teacher of your child's absence. This is all recorded as part of the reporting process at the end of each semester.

A meeting was scheduled to meet the instrumental teachers in week 1. All children confirmed if they were playing or continuing so contracts, loan agreements and timetables could be organized ready to be distributed ASAP. The letter also contained media release permission, information about a \$50 music program fee and purchasing of our school Music Folder with the school emblem embossed on the front for \$11. Children will receive this in their lesson when payment is made.

Instruments will be handed over in the first lesson (Week 3) after they have initially put the instrument together and the loan agreement form has been returned and payment made.

Any children who have recently enrolled at our school and are interested in being a part of our choral or instrumental program or continuing their playing/singing are very welcome to participate. Please come and speak with us ASAP so we can assist in providing you with further information.

Responsibility for learning and organisation only starts with a little guided help. All children love to see the enthusiasm on their parents' faces. It is important that you support your child by encouraging daily practice of at least 10 minutes and by ensuring that he/she is prepared for his/her lesson on the appropriate days. It is going to be hard and challenging at times - but being persistent will result in a feeling of success. Usually by term 2, we see children taking their own initiative to be prepared without reminders. If you feel




your child is struggling, please don't give up. We have strategies to help guide your child into making practice a habit and are here to help. ©







You will receive your allocated instrument and I will check the equipment to make sure everything is okay. Music stands are supplied during lessons, so there is no need to bring one! I ask that all parents of beginners that are borrowing instruments, return the loan form before or on the first lesson and make payment so they are able to bring their instrument home. If your student has the Sound Innovations book, there is a DVD enclosed which has helpful tips on how to assemble, maintain, and produce a sound. 
Junior & Senior Choirs



I'm looking forward to having the children extend their musical abilities outside the music classroom and become a member of our choirs. Auditions for our junior (Years 1,2,3) and senior (years 4, 5 6) choirs were held through the week. All children will be notified on their success.

Our first performance is the Investiture Ceremony on Friday 16th February. All members of Senior choir will be singing for this event. Extra rehearsals to prepare for this performance will be scheduled. You are more than welcome to attend our ceremony and hear the first performance of what is going to be an amazing year of singing!!

Children selected will receive a note this week with a contract of commitment and request to pay \$50 music levy. Please return these notes signed and ensure the media release section is also signed in anticipation of any local performances we may be asked to perform at. Please ensure they have a display folder to keep music/words in and it's brought to every





rehearsal. An electronic roll has been set up so children are recording their attendance. Children will be invited to Eisteddfod and other performances based on their attendance and effort recorded in the roll. Choir rehearsals will be on Friday 2nd break for Seniors and Juniors on Thursday at 1st break. Rehearsals will start in week 4. Before school rehearsals for Seniors will be published via the newsletter later in the term. This will occur on Monday mornings.

Music Shirts, Folders/Music, School Instruments/Fees

All children who are part of the music program are required to pay a compulsory \$50 music program fee. This will assist in maintaining and upgrading music uniforms, maintaining the music library, photocopying, music scores, competition entry fees, upgrading accessories, equipment and instruments and Eisteddfod bus.

All instruments have been cleaned, repaired and returned over the school holidays. If your child is borrowing a school instrument, a loan fee of \$100 is payable before your child is allowed to take the instrument home. This must be accompanied by the Education Queensland's Equipment form signed by you and your child. Please ensure you and your child are aware of the loan agreement conditions for the year.

If there are any breakages or concerns with the instrument, please report to us immediately so it can be repaired. If the damage is deliberate, you will be required to cover the cost of repairs.

Children will be allocated a shirt in the coming weeks which is to be stored at the school. We do ask that your child is prepared for any upcoming performances. It is a requirement that all children wear their shirts, navy blue skirts/skorts or shorts, white ankle socks (above the shoe) and black closed in shoes for performances as indicated on the note.

Folders are required for all performances. These are available from the music teachers and all payments of \$11 are to be made at admin. The folders are very durable and will last your child a long time if well looked after. They will be handed out upon payment during their lesson. If your child has paid and we have missed giving them a folder, please ensure they ask myself or their instrumental instructor.
