There were over 1000 entries across Queensland from 48 regions. Fiftyone of those ensembles were just from Townsville state schools. There were 20 entries in the primary division 2 with our Concert Band receiving Gold. Our Junior Orchestra played beautifully receiving a Bronze and our Senior Orchestra in the top Division 3 receiving Silver. The standard of playing was excellent in all groups across Townsville showing that music is very strong and well supported in our state system.

The beginners had their first under the Spotlight Assessment in week 5. They had to perform their D major scale and Merrily We Roll Along using plucking style. Most students were well prepared.

Still on the note of practising, although the majority of students are in a regular practise routine and setting goals, there are also some students clearly not practising enough or at all from lesson to lesson. To learn a new skill particularly the complexities of an instrument, students need to be practising nearly every day. Please help your child establish a good routine and encourage them at every opportunity to strive to excel at their instrument. A sports training session may go for a couple of hours and be several times a week. Practising skills on an instrument also needs dedicated time at home or training. The difference is that it is usually individual training with group training in lessons and orchestra.

Students will be issued their report card at the end of this term and the instrumental curriculum has very clear guidelines for marking.




The percussion students will start with their playing tests on Friday, 2nd June. They have all received a handout with expectations and information during their lesson.




Music Shirts, Folders/Music, School Instruments/Fees
