It's Eisteddfod week and we're all very excited!! It is surely going to be a very busy and hectic week, yet very rewarding at the same time! We wish all 186 students the best as you participate in this grand event and hope you enjoy the experience of performing at the Civic Theatre. We are very proud of your efforts at rehearsals so far and know you will receive positive feedback on your performances.

Thank you to the overwhelming response of parents who indicated they could help with supervision. I sent home letters last week requesting your assistance. If you can no longer volunteer your time, please let me know ASAP. We hope to see you at the theatre if you can make it to support your child in their performances. Admission is \$10 a session, \$20 a day or \$50 for the week.

It is important your child is prepared and organized for the day. Please check the new timetable (at end of this newsletter) to make sure you have lunch, water bottles, instruments, music, costumes etc. for the correct day. There were some time changes with buses - so please check times carefully. Please wear your black shoes and white socks and correct coloured navy blue skorts, skirts or shorts. It may be a good idea to prepare the day before!! © Your music shirt will be hanging up in the music room for you to change into when you arrive. It is only the Senior Choir who need to bring costumes

etc (as indicated below) on Tuesday, 11th September for the novelty section.

Our selected 8 year 6 folk group children will be wearing overalls and have organized themselves for costumes also.

Thank you for those getting permissions back quickly. If your child is sick on the day and/or unable to attend, please inform the school immediately to let us know ASAP. (Phone - 4799 1333). It is better to avoid ordering tuckshop on the days your child is involved at the Eisteddfod.

A reminder that our first year instrumentalists will be required to hand back their instruments at the end of term 4 so they are cleaned and repaired for our 2019 new recruits. Our 2018 beginner players have excelled greatly with their newly acquired skills and are sounding fabulous. We would hope that a lot of them are continuing in 2019. You will be required to purchase your own instrument as mentioned at our recruiting night and now is a good time to start looking for a good quality 2nd hand instrument. We do have a list available on preferred brands and further information on purchasing your own instrument that will go home early term 4. There are a lot of good 2nd hand instruments around at a good price - you just have to find them. There have been many good brands advertised on FB Buy and Sell websites. Now is the time to start looking. There are a lot of stores with various payment plans available also. Please

ask your child's instrumental teacher for further information on purchasing an instrument. If you play our more expensive instruments such as cellos, tenor sax, bass clarinet, double bass, euphonium, baritone and tuba, you will be loaned the instrument again in 2019.

KSHS Arts Academy Auditions

Children who have applied to be part of the <u>Kirwan Arts Academy</u> were asked to have submitted their application a fortnight ago. Letters were sent out to all applicants notifying you of specific audition details. Children will be auditioned as they arrive so it's a good idea to get there early. 




What an eventful term this has been!





Senior Choir Children only need to bring showercaps/head towels/bath robe or towel, rubber ducky and kazoos (Tuesday 11th September). They do not require shoes on stage, but will need to wear some sort of closed footwear to and from the theatre. Some children have mentioned wearing slippers......?? Not compulsory but welcomed if they'd like to wear. \odot Children will wear their uniform to school and change at 1st break. The whole idea of this section is to take singing to a different level including a bit of fun with actions. A reminder that we do not ask that you go to great expense for a 5 min performance.
