Hope you all enjoyed your break with family and friends. Welcome back as we prepare for a very busy term 4.

Please check the date claimer below with all instrumental/choral members detailing dates that your child will be required for various events and in the note that went home with your child at the end of week 1. All children in both choirs and instrumental programs are performing on Wednesday, 23rd October. This is our last formal performance for the year. It is expected that every member of the choral and instrumental groups are in attendance as a requirement of you being part of the instrumental/choral program. As we were unable to perform at the Eisteddfod last term you are invited to our night starting at 6pm in TCBC to be entertained.

A sausage sizzle and drinks are available to purchase starting from 5.00pm. All children are required to be at the music room by 5.00pm to eat first, change and tune up ready to start promptly at 6pm.

It is essential that there is no talking or movement during the performances and concert etiquette is of upmost importance. A reminder that all children must be supervised and playground equipment is out of bounds. There is also no food or drink allowed in TCBC.

If your child is interested in learning an instrument and starting in our instrumental program for 2020, you are also invited to be guests at our Performer's night and be

entertained by our current members and see what our program has to offer and what your child may be part of from 2020.

All notes for prospective instrumentalists have were sent home last Friday and are due back no later than this Tuesday, 22nd October, 2019. Current instrumentalists need to have returned your continuing note by this date also so we can plan for our next intake. Testing for our potential students will happen in Week 4.

INSTRUMENTAL RECRUITING 2020

We have very limited spots for our new recruits to our instrumental program for 2020. This is determined on instrumental teachers, time allocation, school instruments and current students already in the program. Selected children in years 3 and interested children in year 2 have received an application to apply for testing. Any child in years 3, 4 & 5 who would like to be considered can collect an application form from the office.

Acceptance to the program is based on subject achievement, behaviour, parental support and whether or not your child is physically attributed to their chosen instrument.

Education Queensland states that only children in years 2 are invited to the strings program and years 3 - 5 for woodwind, brass and percussion. If your child in year 2 is not interested in


learning a string instrument, you are asked to wait until the next intake at the end of next year.


Forms must be returned no later than Tuesday 22nd October so your child can be physically tested on their chosen instrument in week 5. You will be notified of your child's success by week 7 and are expected to attend an **Information** Evening on Wednesday, 20th November to find out further information. If your child is accepted, there will be a cost of purchasing instrumental requirements (book, folder, stand, accessories), compulsory music program fee of \$50 and an instrumental hire fee of \$100 for the year unless a violin/viola player. We look forward to seeing our prospective players join our program for 2020. If you have further questions, please come and see us.

Current instrumentalists in years 3 - 5 have also receive a note on whether they are continuing for 2020. It is important that this note is returned by <u>Tuesday 22nd October</u> or ASAP so we can allocate numbers for our 2020 instrumental program. If your child is not continuing, you must let their teacher know ASAP.

1st Year Instrumentalists

A reminder that our first year instrumentalists will be required to hand back their instruments at the end of term 4 so they are cleaned and repaired for our 2020 new recruits. Our 2019 beginner players have excelled greatly with their newly acquired skills and are sounding fabulous. We would hope that a lot of them are continuing in 2020. You will be required to purchase your own instrument as mentioned at our recruiting night and now is a good time to start looking for a good quality 2nd hand instrument.





We do have a list available on preferred brands and further information on purchasing your own instrument that is attached to the continuing note. There are a lot of good 2nd hand instruments around at a good price - you just have to find them. There are a lot of stores with various payment plans available also. Please ask your child's instrumental teacher for further information on purchasing and brands to look for if you require further information.

If you play our more expensive instruments such as cellos, tenor sax, bass clarinet, double bass, euphonium, baritone and tuba, you will be loaned the instrument again in 2020.

If you would like further information in regards to continuing in the program or about our recruiting process, please come and see one of us.
