Recruitment testing for 2020 has now been finalised. Testing was done to see if your child is suited to their preferred instrument and if they are physically able to blow it if necessary. Children were physically tested on every instrument. Unfortunately the preferred instrument is not always suited due to physical attributes, so the child is offered another choice when they see what is available to them. All children who applied received a note on Friday to inform if they have been accepted, unaccepted or put on a waiting list. Acceptance is based on assessment covering pitch, rhythm, embouchure, musicality, behaviour, numeracy, literacy and reading level achievements by the instrumental instructor, classroom music teacher and classroom teacher. We also look at how many children are continuing in the program and how many minutes of instrumental instruction has been allocated to the school for 2020. Class sizes are based on an average of 6 children per class and distributing instruments to find a balance for ensembles. All children who were accepted or put on a waiting list are expected to attend our information evening in TCBC on Wednesday, 20th November, starting at 6pm. This is a valuable session to find out more information on our program and your chance to ask specific questions to the instrumental teachers. Please don't forget to bring your acceptance letter to hand in on the night. We look forward to seeing all our prospective new recruits for 2020. ©






Music Shirts, Folders/Music, School Instruments


All instruments will be collected by <u>Friday</u>, <u>6th</u>, <u>December</u> for repairs and cleaning and to get ready for our 2020 instrumentalists.

If you are a beginner and continuing into 2020, you need to purchase your own instrument. If you need further information on this, please contact your child's instrumental teacher or myself.

If your child has outgrown their instrument or looking at upgrading, you are more than welcome to advertise the instrument through this school newsletter. We always have parents looking for good quality 2nd hand instruments. Please contact me with any information you would like published for the next newsletter.

If your child is eligible for borrowing their instrument again for next year if it is not needed for repairs, you may keep it to practise over the holidays. A holiday loan agreement form must be signed. You need





to see Mrs Coleman or your instrumental teacher ASAP.

Instrumental Loan fee is \$100 for the year and there will also be a \$50 program fee next year to cover resourcing, uniform and Eisteddfod bus. All fees are compulsory and must be paid prior to your child receiving the instrument and participating. You will be invoiced in 2020 for this.
