
Positive Behaviour for Learning


The Willows State School strives to create a safe and positive learning environment for all students. As a school community, we work together to enable students to engage in learning through our Positive Behaviour for Learning Plan (PBL). The primary goal of this plan is to promote consistency in our high standards fostering our school rules of being Safe, Respectful and Responsible. The students learn about PBL through fortnightly lessons that target our behaviour expectations. These lessons also feature at our whole school and year level parades. The school has signage in each area to inform and remind the students of The Willows expectations.

Our school has 3 Positive Behaviour Mascots, who were devised, named and voted on by the students of 2017. Waldo, Olive and Willow are seen around the school in many different locations. Their names bring the WOW to our school!




Students, classes and cohorts are continually acknowledged and rewarded for displaying Safe, Respectful and Responsible behaviours throughout the year. Please regularly ask your child if they understand the expectations in different locations around the school and celebrate the rewards your child receives.





Students have a goal to collect 75 stars each 5 week cycle and then will be able to attend that 5 week cycle reward activity. Also if they have had no major behavioural incident in the term they can attend an End of Term celebration. The teachers and students are currently deciding on the mid-term and end of term celebration for their cohorts.


Our school expectations are printed on signage around the school for teachers, students, parents and visitors. This is so we have a calm and consistent environment conducive to learning.







PBL Fortnightly Focus Lessons




- Lessons are explicitly taught by the classroom teacher

What is Positive Behaviour for Learning?

▶PBL is:

➤ A systems approach for establishing the social culture and individualised behavioural supports needed for schools to be effective learning environments for all students.

► Evidence-based features of PBL

- ▶ Prevention
- ▶ Define and teach positive social expectations
- ► Acknowledge positive behaviour
- Arrange consistent consequences for problem behaviour
- On-going collection and use of data for decision-making
- Continuum of intensive, individual interventions.
- ► Administrative leadership Team-based implementation (Systems that support effective practices)

The Willows State School has **Year Level Parades** once a week. These parades focus on the high standards of behaviour expected and are a celebration of Excellent Learning, Behaviour and Attendance. The students will receive certificates to acknowledge their achievement. We invite parents/carers to come along and join the celebration of student success.
