## Go for Green - To assist with practise!

THE IMPORTANCE OF PRACTISE

It is essential that children are at rehearsals on time ready to start as they prepare for Fanfare. Both orchestra and concert band have already got pieces ready for performing. The work effort has been fantastic - however some children are arriving late. Children need to be at school by 7.50am to help set up and be seated by 8.00am to get a good 40 mins practise. School starts at 8.45am so children need to be packed up and ready to head to class

When new pieces and scales are learnt in the lesson it is important to go over these new ideas often so we are familiar and comfortable with the new songs. This enables us to feel confident and relaxed in the lessons as well and you will enjoy it a lot more! A few little things to help you.

- Keep your fingernails short!
- Organise your music bag the night before with everything you will need.
- Fill out your practise chart as soon as you have finished practising! (only count actual playing time please)
- Set a timer to help you practise. When the buzzer goes off that's your practise done!
- ❖ 60 min per week is the minimum amount to ensure progress each week.
- Set yourself a goal and try to achieve this goal. Happy playing and I look forward to the rest of term.

Congratulations to all the instrumental children working hard on GOING GREEN and demonstrating some fantastic playing. Also earning extra stars for their star charts. We also have children being rewarded with certificates for Brass student of the week. The energy and enthusiasm is fantastic. Keep up the great practising and efforts - Even over the holiday's!!





#### (SHEP) State Honours Ensemble Program

SHEP is a firmly established aspect of music learning in Queensland, bringing together young people from all over the State, in regional centres and Brisbane to share their passion for making music. Its pursuit of excellence defines it as the highest quality performance avenue available to young ensemble-based instrumentalists outside of the Queensland Conservatorium and the Young Conservatorium. It is a unique opportunity for Voice, Strings, Wind, Brass and Percussion middle school students from North Queensland to work with their peers in an intensive environment of musical excellence. The program is guided by a team of international and national conductors from the Queensland Conservatorium and will be held at Ryan Catholic College from 22<sup>nd</sup> - 24<sup>th</sup> June.

Our instrumental teachers nominated 10 students in year 5 & 6 who would benefit educationally and improve their musical skills by participating in this intensive weekend program. The following students were nominated and will be contacted via email if successful. 
String Orchestra will be continuing as normal each week before school Wednesday mornings 7:45-8:40AM. Term 2 rehearsals will resume in WEEK 1!


#### HOLIDAY's

Monday 11 - 3,

Hey Brassies!

Just a reminder that brass students assessment for term 1 is this Monday (week 9). Students have been preparing pieces over the last few weeks and are expected to practice these songs consistently while focusing on the "problem" bars rather than jut playing through the whole piece all the time. Different groups have different pieces and areas to focus on.

Groups A, B, C - choose either song no. 9, 10, 11 on page 6. You will also play 1 song you have never seen before. This skill is called sight reading. You are given 5 minutes to practice your sight reading piece during your lesson before playing for Ms Clarke and your group members.

Group D - we have been exploring major and minor sounds (tonality). You have already completed your aural major/minor test. On Monday you will song ex. 136 and a sight reading piece in a minor tonality. You will be given 5 minutes to practice your sight reading piece during your lesson before playing for Ms Clarke and your group members.

Group E - we have been focussing on playing your quavers rhythms consistently and using our counting skills to help with this. As well as this, you will demonstrate your understanding of dynamics (volume levels) in music and perform them in your pieces.





### Are you working towards getting rewarded for your efforts?




RED DOT: I attended my lesson but I am UNORGANISED (didn't bring either my instrument, book or folder)
