Welcome Back to Term 3!!

Timetables for Term 3 are on display outside the music room and have been emailed to class teachers and given to your child. Children should be organized and prepared with their instrument and books and know when lessons are. It is the child's responsibility to remind their class teacher for when they will be out of class.

Please be aware we are following the COVID guidelines set out by QLD DOE for lessons and rehearsals as follows.

Instrumental music programs, ensembles and choirs are able to rehearse in the school environment provided the following safety protocols are in place:

- at least 1.5 metres between singers/players in all directions and no more than 1 person per 4m2
- choirs or bands that usually use a stage may need to move down to the hall floor to ensure physical distancing.
 Podiums/platforms with risers should not be used
- where possible, choir practice should be held outdoors. If it is not possible to hold practice outdoors, open windows and doors or ensure air conditioning is on.
- ensure students clean hands before and after the lesson
- ensure instruments are not shared
- students should not face each other when singing or playing wind instruments

• students with wind instruments should have their own spit rag, which is placed under the instrument while it is being played. The spit rag should not be handled by anyone else and should be kept by the student in a zip-lock bag or container.

Inter-school and external venue rehearsals or performances are not to be undertaken at this time.

The Instrumental Music Program guidelines for managing hazards associated with COVID-19 provides guidance regarding risk management strategies and hygiene requirements that must be in place.

Monday - Beginner Strings Thursday - Continuing lessons and String Orchestra


This term we have two assessments to aim for. Week 4 sight reading test and Week 8 a solo assessment.


<u>String Orchestra Orchestra</u> -<u>Carla Mulligan</u>

SENIOR Concert Band


Tuesday 8.00am Ruby Johnson




Please ensure your child is collecting their instrument to take home. We do not want them stored at school. Keep up the practise when you can!!
