The information night will inform you of the process for applying and success in the program and we can check numbers and offer positions to children who may be on a waiting list before the end of the year.

If your child is accepted, there will be a cost of purchasing instrumental requirements (book, folder, stand, accessories), compulsory music program fee of \$50 and an instrumental hire fee of \$100 for the year unless a violin/viola player. We look forward to seeing our prospective players join our program for 2021. If you have further questions, please write them down for our instrumental information night.

A reminder that our first year instrumentalists will be required to hand back their instruments at the end of term 4 so they are cleaned and repaired for our 2021 new recruits. You will be required to purchase your own instrument as mentioned at our recruiting night and now is a good time to start looking for a good quality 2<sup>nd</sup> hand instrument.

There are a lot of good 2<sup>nd</sup> hand instruments around at a good price - you just have to find them. There are a lot of stores with various payment plans available also. Please ask your child's instrumental teacher for further information on purchasing and brands to look for if you require further information.





Hey Brassies!

We are at the halfway point in the term and now is the time to practise your instrument at home with intent and complete focus. You have been working on your pieces for the last few weeks to learn the rhythms, pitching notes and accurate finger patterns. Now is the time to focus on fluently performing extra details found in your music such as dynamic changes



(volume), articulation changes (slurs and tonguing notes) etc.

As well as this, students must bath their brass instrument before the end of week 8. This is both for maintaining hygiene standards in the instrument you own or returning a SQUEAKY clean school instrument ready for the next student to have the opportunity to learn and play it. It is written in your instrumental music contract (that student and parents signed) to say that you would look after the instrument and keep it working to a high standard. A highly functional brass instrument means slides and valves to be moving freely and easily (not stiff and the metal parts rubbing against each other making a metal grating sound). In the case of COVID-19 prevention, bathing your instrument is a necessity.


Ms Clarke has gone over how to clean instruments in lessons and students have received a handout about it. Otherwise there are videos on you tube you can watch as well



If you are a beginner and continuing into 2021, you need to purchase your own instrument. If you need further information on this, please contact your child's instrumental teacher or myself.




