WOW!! Well done to all our instrumentalists!!! Great reading of the timetable, being organised and getting to lessons on time this fortnight. It seems that all children who were suited to their instrument selected in 2020. All children have played their instrument and are ready to start in week 4. Instrumental teachers have sent home the loan agreement forms, commitment forms and requirements lists. These payments should appear in your QParents soon, but if not, please pay at the office. The instrument is yours when the loan agreement form is returned.

Please keep reminding children to check the timetables in the morning and collecting children in their groups so that lessons can start promptly. This will allow children to get their full 30 minute lessons. If your child is absent, please notify your instrumental teacher so it can be recorded correctly. Lessons and rehearsals are always on unless specified on timetable or you've been notified by the teachers. It is sometimes hard to notify when instrumental teachers are absent due to illness or other, they do not get replaced like a classroom teacher, so if they are absent, lessons/rehearsals will not be on. A sign will be placed on the instrumental door and teachers and children notified. We thank you in advance for this understanding - sometimes we will only be notified in the morning of and may be possible to post on the school facebook page. There will be supervision at school if your child is there early.


If your child is involved in a school activity, away on excursion, needed in class for assessment, please contact your child's instrumental teacher so lessons can be accommodated for. If your child forgets their instrument for the day – it is still important that they turn up to the lesson so they are aware of what is happening and what to do during their week of practice ready for the next lesson.

A reminder that if you find a fault or there is something wrong with the instrument, please return it so it can be looked at and repaired if needed. Any damage caused to the instrument through misuse or 'droppage' etc is at borrower's expense. Instrumental Folders are being distributed this week. There are still a couple of outstanding payments. Please advise when your child has paid so a folder can be given to them.

Practice is essential for progress. Your child will only succeed with a good practice regime being set in place from the beginning and your encouragement, support and praise will only enhance improvement. Persistence and setting short term goals is the pathway to success. If you feel you or your child are struggling, please come and see us so we can assist in making this 'life—long' learning experience fun.

THE IMPORTANCE OF PRACTISE

When new pieces and scales are learnt in the lesson it is important to go over these new ideas often so we are familiar and comfortable with the new songs. This enables us to feel confident and relaxed in the lessons as well and you will enjoy it a lot more! A few little things to help you.

- Keep your fingernails short!
- Organise your music bag the night before with everything you will need.
- Fill out your practise chart as soon as you have finished practising! (only count actual playing time please)
- Set a timer to help you practise. When the buzzer goes off that's your practise done!
- ❖ 60 min per week is the minimum amount to ensure progress each week.
- Set yourself a goal and try to achieve this goal. Happy playing and I look forward to the rest of term.

BAND KARATE/ BAND NINJA

We have a new system to help students to achieve manageable practice and performance goals within their method book. "Band Karate" involves students aiming to play certain songs as a solo for the teacher and group. The overall goal is to practice regularly to help you play these

songs and therefore move your name tile across the belt posters and collect the corresponding belt colours. We hope these smaller manageable performance goals will motivate students to practice at home and get excited about learning new pieces rather than being apprehensive!

At times the belt songs will correlate with assessment pieces, but students have been explicitly told that this is not always the case. First and foremost belt songs are a tool to help with practice an improving your playing skills in general and therefore students need to STILL PRACTICE the other songs set for homework my the teacher.

This year there is a new extension level called Band Ninja. Band Ninja represents level 3 of the IM curriculum and students who are starting Book 2 of their method book!!!





Senior Concert Band - Monday 7.40am Tina Greenfield




Junior & Senior Choirs



RED DOT: I attended my lesson but I didn't bring my instrument and/or book and/or folder. I need to work on my organization.




Music Shirts, Folders/Music, School Instruments/Fees

Thank you to all our families with the prompt payments of fees and returns of contract and loan agreement forms. All children who are part of the music program are required to pay a compulsory \$50 music program fee. There are still are few outstanding. This will assist in maintaining and upgrading music uniforms, maintaining the music library, photocopying, music scores, competition entry fees, upgrading accessories, equipment and instruments and Eisteddfod bus.

MUSIC UNIFORM: We do ask that your child is prepared for any upcoming performances. It is a requirement that all children wear with their shirts, navy blue skirts, skorts or shorts, white ankle CREW socks (above the shoe) and black closed in shoes for performances as indicated on the note. Music shirts are stored at school.

Folders are required for all performances. These are available from the music teachers and all payments of \$11 are to be made at admin. The folders are very





durable and will last your child a long time if well looked after. They will be handed out upon payment during their lesson. If your child has paid and we have missed giving them a folder, please ensure they ask myself or their instrumental instructor.
