WOW!! Well done to all our instrumentalists!!! Great reading of the timetable, being organised and getting to lessons on time this fortnight. Thank you also for getting your forms back. We still have some loan agreement forms outstanding. Please return these as soon as possible so that we can give you your instrument.

Please keep reminding children to check the timetables and to arrive for their lessons promptly. This will allow children to get their full 30 minute lessons. If your child is absent, notify your instrumental teacher so it can be recorded correctly. A copy of lessons and rehearsals are always on the notice board at the performing arts block. Please note that if your instrumental teacher is away ill they will make every attempt to coordinate an alternate lesson time if possible. A sign will be placed on the instrumental door and teachers and children notified.

If your child is involved in a school activity, away on excursion, needed in class for assessment, please contact your child's instrumental teacher so lessons can be accommodated for. If your child forgets their instrument for the day – it is still important that they turn up to the lesson so they are aware of what is happening and what to do during their week of practice ready for the next lesson.

If you have any concerns regarding your instrument let us know. Any damage caused to the instrument through misuse or 'droppage' etc is at borrower's expense

as stated in the contract. Instrumental Folders are being distributed slowly through the Admin office. There are still a couple of outstanding payments.

Our beginner students have met the challenge and started beginner band much earlier than expected. We are very impressed with their enthusiasm. Tina Greenfield meets with them second break on Monday's. Please ensure all new percussion, wind and brass students have their instruments with them on Monday as well as for their lessons on their day.

We are still looking for more beginner percussion students. If you are new to the school or would like to be part of the percussion group, see the music teachers for further information.


## <u>Woodwind</u> - Tina Greenfield <u>tgree255@eq.edu.au</u>

#### THE IMPORTANCE OF PRACTISE

When new pieces and scales are learnt in the lesson it is important to go over these new ideas often so we are familiar and comfortable with the new songs. This enables us to feel confident and relaxed in the lessons as well and you will enjoy it a lot more! A few little things to help you.

- Keep your fingernails short!
- Organise your music bag the night before with everything you will need.
- Fill out your practise chart as soon as you have finished practising! (only count actual playing time please)
- Set a timer to help you practise. When the buzzer goes off that's your practise done!
- 60 min per week is the minimum amount to ensure progress each week.
- Set yourself a goal and try to achieve this goal. Happy playing and I look forward to the rest of term.


GREEN DOT: I attended my lesson, practised AND brought all of my equipment. I am doing my very best to be a better musician.

RED DOT: I attended my lesson but I didn't bring my instrument and/or book and/or folder. I need to work on my organization.

The second award works in with our school PBL where students doing an outstanding

#### Music Shirts, Folders/Music,

Children will be allocated a shirt in the coming weeks which is to be stored at the school. We do ask that your child is prepared for any upcoming performances. It is a requirement that all children in the music program wear with their shirts, navy blue skirts, skorts or shorts, white ankle CREW socks (above the shoe) and black closed in shoes for performances as indicated on the note.

Folders are required for all performances. These are available from the office and all payments of \$11 are to be made at Admin. The folders are very durable and will last your child a long time if well looked after. They will be handed out upon payment during their lesson. If your child has paid and we have missed giving them a folder, please ensure they ask myself or their instrumental instructor.
