
Well done to everyone who has already been assessed. I'm looking forward to hearing more from you in the lessons next week and what improvements you have made.

THE IMPORTANCE OF PRACTICE

When new pieces and scales are learned in the lesson it is important to go over these new ideas often so we are familiar and comfortable with the new songs. This enables us to feel confident and relaxed in



the lessons as well and you will enjoy it a lot more! A few little things to help you -

- Keep your fingernails short!
- Organise your music bag the night before with everything you will need.
- Fill out your practice chart as soon as you have finished practising! (only count actual playing time please).
- Set a timer to help you practice. When the buzzer goes off that's your practice done!
- 60min per week is the minimum amount to ensure progress each week.
- Set yourself a goal and try to achieve this goal.

RED DOT: I attended my lesson but I didn't bring my instrument and/or book and/or folder. I need to work on my organisation.


