Welcome Back to Term 3!!

Timetables for Term 3 are on display outside the music room and have been emailed to class teachers and given to your child. Children should be organised and prepared with their instrument and books and know when lessons are. It is the child's responsibility to remind their class teacher for when they will be out of class or need to change their lessons due to clashes with assessment, excursions, etc.

We have a busy term as we prepare for the Annual Townsville Eisteddfod. Permission notes should be commencing to come home by the end of Week 5. I'm in the process of booking buses and producing a timetable of events. Please pencil Tuesday 6th - Monday 12th September into your diary. Some families have not paid the program fee which covers the Eisteddfod bus. Please make payment if you haven't before we head to the Eisteddfod so your child can attend. It is an expectation that all members of the Instrumental and Choral programs are attending all rehearsals. If there is an absence, we ask that it is being followed through with the ensemble teacher via email, phone call or note. If children have missed too many rehearsals, they will not be invited to the Eisteddfod. We often have some children upset when they don't receive an invitation to attend. Please ensure that they are organised and ready for each rehearsal and lesson. Keep up the practice

and attendance and your efforts will be

rewarded.

It is important that children are dressed appropriately in our school music uniform for the event. Please ensure you are organised with appropriate navy blue skorts/skirts/shorts (of appropriate length), black shoes and white ankle (Crew) socks. Music shirts will be given out on day of performance and returned when they arrive back at school to be washed and ready for next event.




Junior Concert Band Monday 2nd Break 1.10pm
