
If your child is interested in learning an instrument and starting in our Instrumental Program for 2023, you are also invited to be guests at our Performer's Night and be entertained by our current members and see what our program has to offer and what your child may be part of from 2023.

INSTRUMENTAL PROGRAM

We have very limited spots for our new recruits to our Instrumental Program for 2023. This is determined on instrumental teachers, time allocation, school instruments and current students already in the program. All children in Year 2 and 3 will receive an application to apply for testing. Any child in Year 4 and 5 who would like to be considered can come and collect an application form from the office. Acceptance to the program is based on subject achievement, behaviour, parental support and whether or not your child is physically attributed to their chosen instrument. Application forms will be sent home Week 1 next term.

Education Queensland states that only children in Year 2 are invited to the Strings program and Years 3 to 5 for





Woodwind, Brass and Percussion. <u>If your child in Year 2 is not interested in learning a string instrument, you are asked to wait until the next intake at the end of next year.</u>

Forms must be returned no later than Friday 21st October so your child can be physically tested on their chosen instrument in Week 4. You will be notified of your child's success by Week 5 and are expected to attend an Information Evening on Wednesday, 9th November to find out further information. If your child is accepted, there will be a cost of purchasing instrumental requirements (book, folder, stand, accessories), compulsory music program fee for all and an instrumental hire fee for the year unless a violin/viola or percussion player. We look forward to seeing our prospective players join our program for 2023. If you have further questions, please come and see me.

Current instrumentalists in Years 3 to 5 will also receive a note in Week 1 about whether they are continuing in 2023. It is important that this note is returned by Friday, 14th October so we can allocate numbers for our 2023 Instrumental Program. If your child is not continuing, you must let their teacher know ASAP.

A reminder that our first year instrumentalists will be required to hand back their instruments at the end of Term 4, so they can be cleaned and repaired for our 2023 new recruits. Our 2022 beginner players have excelled greatly with their newly acquired skills and are sounding fabulous. We would hope that a lot of them are continuing in 2023. You will be required to purchase your own instrument, as mentioned at our recruiting night and

now is a good time to start looking for a good quality secondhand instrument.

We do have a list available on preferred brands and further information on purchasing your own instrument that will go home in Week 1, Term 4. There are a lot of good secondhand instruments around at a good price - you just have to find them. There are a lot of stores with various payment plans available also. Please ask your child's instrumental teacher for further information on purchasing and brands to look for if you require further information. If you play our more expensive instruments such as cellos, tenor sax, bass clarinet, double bass, euphonium, baritone and tuba, you will be loaned the instrument again in 2023.






