It has been great seeing all students get back into the swing of lessons and home practice.



For continuing students, please make sure you are working on your assessment tasks. Assessments are due in Week 9. If you are not sure what you are playing for the assessment, please let me know.


Senior Concert Band Monday 7.40am

Monday morning is used as Ensemble practise time, and I would love to spend more time on putting the parts together, rather than individual students learning their parts. Here are a few tools for you to help support your child.

 Listening to the song on YouTube -Please type in the song title and





composer into YouTube. Students can use this to practise along at home.

- 2. Writing out notes/beats If students do not feel secure in their music reading, please support them in allowing the students to write out their notes or rhythms at home as part of their practise time.
- 3. Ask a teacher If your child is struggling with a specific part, please let them know that they can go and ask either Mr Brunskill, Ms Clarke, Ms Greenfield on the days that they are here, or Mrs Coleman if they are really stuck. Students should try to work it out themselves by working out their rhythms and notes, however, if they are still struggling, please let us know.


<u>GO FOR GREEN - Recognition of</u> Practice and Great Work

HOW ARE YOU TRACKING?

Students need to maintain the consistent home practice on their instrument in order to continue steadily progressing on their playing technique and note reading skills. To help acknowledge those students who regularly practise, are organized for their lessons with correct equipment and are turning up on time, the music staff have developed 2 rewards.

GREEN DOT: I attended my lesson, practised AND brought all of my equipment.





I am doing my very best to be a better musician.

YELLOW DOT: I attended my lesson but I <u>DIDN'T</u> practise enough this week. I need to practise to be a better musician.

RED DOT: I attended my lesson but I didn't bring my instrument and/or book and/or folder. I need to work on my organisation.

The second award works in with our school PBL where students doing an outstanding job in lessons, practising, improving skills and "WOW-ing" their teacher will receive stars towards their '75 Star Chart' in their classroom towards the end of Week 5 party etc.

Music Shirts, Folders/Music, School Instruments/Fees

All children who are part of the music program are required to pay a compulsory \$55 music program fee. This will assist in maintaining and upgrading music uniforms, maintaining the music library, photocopying, music scores, competition entry fees, upgrading accessories, equipment and instruments and Eisteddfod bus.

Children will be allocated a shirt in the coming weeks which is to be stored at the school. We do ask that your child is prepared for any upcoming performances.

It is a requirement that all children in the music program wear with their shirts, navy blue skirts, skorts or shorts, white ankle CREW socks (above the shoe) and black closed in shoes for performances as indicated on the note.

Folders are required for all performances. These are available from the office and all payments of \$14 are to be made at admin. The folders are very durable and will last your child a long time if well looked after. They will be handed out upon payment. If your child has paid and we have missed giving them a folder, please ensure they ask myself or their Instrumental Instructor.
