

Well done to all of you for completing your first assessments. It was great to see so many of you ready to go.


Senior Concert Band Monday 7.40am

HOW ARE YOU TRACKING?

Students need to maintain the consistent home practice on their instrument in order to continue steadily progressing on their playing technique and note reading skills. To help acknowledge those students who regularly practise, are organized for their lessons with correct equipment and are turning up on time, the music staff have developed 2 rewards.

GREEN DOT: I attended my lesson, practised AND brought all of my equipment. I am doing my very best to be a better musician.

YELLOW DOT: I attended my lesson but I <u>DIDN'T</u> practise enough this week. I need to practise to be a better musician.


RED DOT: I attended my lesson but I didn't bring my instrument and/or book and/or folder. I need to work on my organisation.

THE IMPORTANCE OF PRACTISE

When new pieces and scales are learned in the lesson, it is important to go over these new ideas often so we are familiar and comfortable with the new songs. This enables us to feel confident and relaxed in the lessons as well and you will enjoy it a lot more! A few little things to help you.

- Keep your fingernails short!
- Organise your music bag the night before with everything you will need.
- Fill out your practice chart as soon as you have finished practising! (only count actual playing time please)





- Set a timer to help you practise. When the buzzer goes off that's your practice done!
- 60min per week is the minimum amount to ensure progress each week.

Music Shirts, Folders/Music, School Instruments/Fees

All children who are part of the music program are required to pay a compulsory \$55 music program fee. This will assist in maintaining and upgrading music uniforms, maintaining the music library, photocopying, music scores, competition entry fees, upgrading accessories, equipment and instruments and Eisteddfod bus.

Children will be allocated a shirt in the coming weeks which is to be stored at the school. We do ask that your child is prepared for any upcoming performances.

It is a requirement that all children in the music program wear with their shirts, navy blue skirts, skorts or shorts, white ankle CREW socks (above the shoe) and black closed in shoes for performances as indicated on the note.

Folders are required for all performances. These are available from the office and all payments of \$14 are to be made at Admin. The folders are very durable and will last your child a long time if well looked after. They will be handed out upon payment. If your child has paid and we have missed giving them a folder, please ensure they ask myself or their Instrumental Instructor.

All instruments need to be collected from the instrumental room and taken home
